|--|---------|---------------------|----------------------|
| Current daily or occasional smoker | 21.6 | 8.3* (3.0-13.6) | 22.8 (16.7-28.9) |
| Never 5 or more drinks on one occasion | 67.2 | 84.6 (76.6-92.6) | 70.3 (61.2-79.4) |

□ Agincourt has lower smoking and alcohol use

 Agincourt has lower teen births, H-D has higher teen births and low birth weight





What the tale tells us

- Immigrant neighbourhoods
 vary a great deal socio-demographically
 have different health needs
- Needs-based planning
 would suggest quite different programs and services for each area depending on needs

- □ Child health/young families (child poverty)
- □ Adult health and disease (chronic disease, oral health, mental health, disability)
- Seniors (adult indicators plus medications, home care, long-term care, disability)
- □ **Prevention** (cancer screening, immunizations, checkups)
- Mortality (age-adjusted, PYLL, healthy life expectancy)
- □ Equity (by SES, immigration)
- Watch for maps of clustering, walking and transit times, interactive mapping
