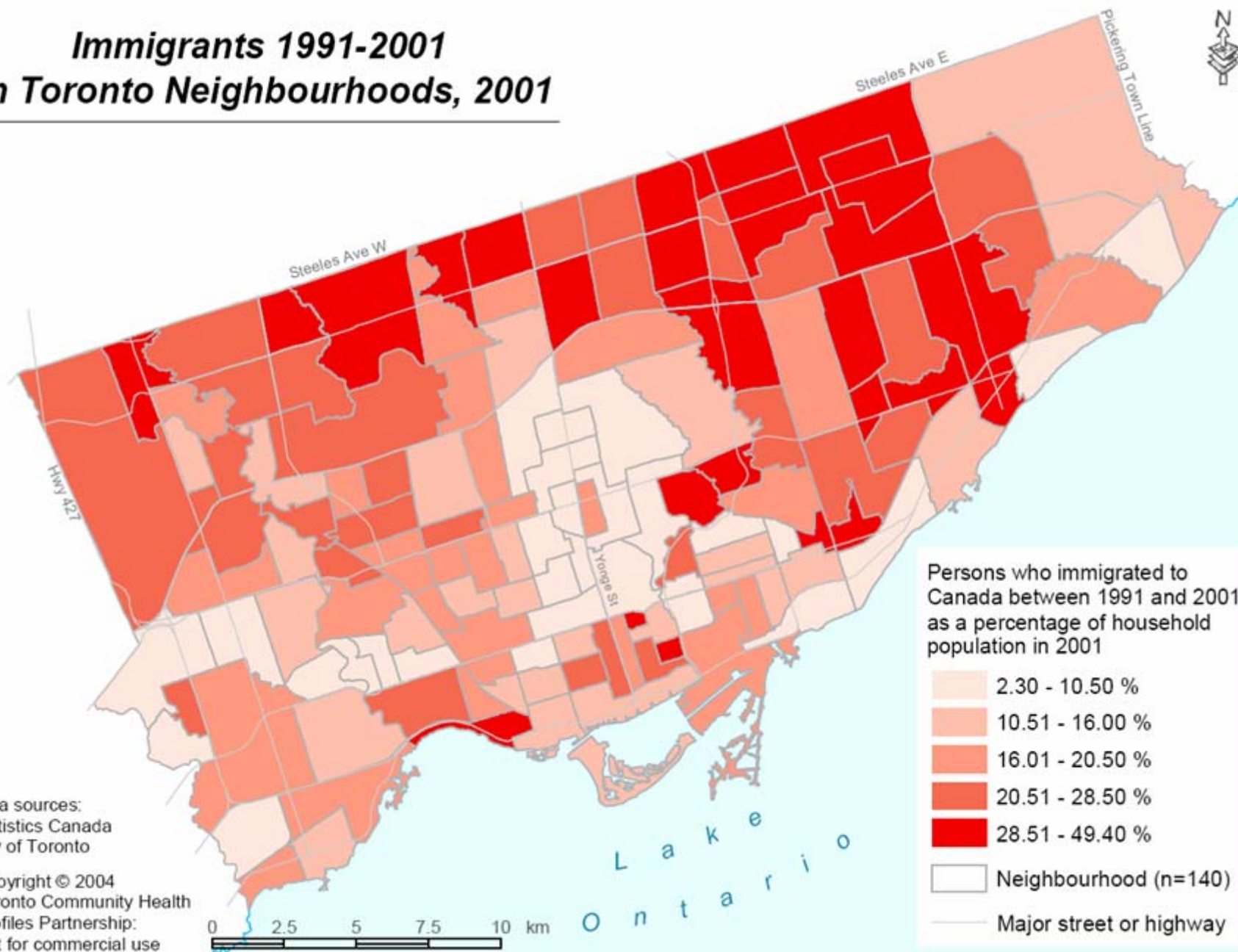

- Immigrant neighbourhoods, H-D has higher low income and lower educational attainment

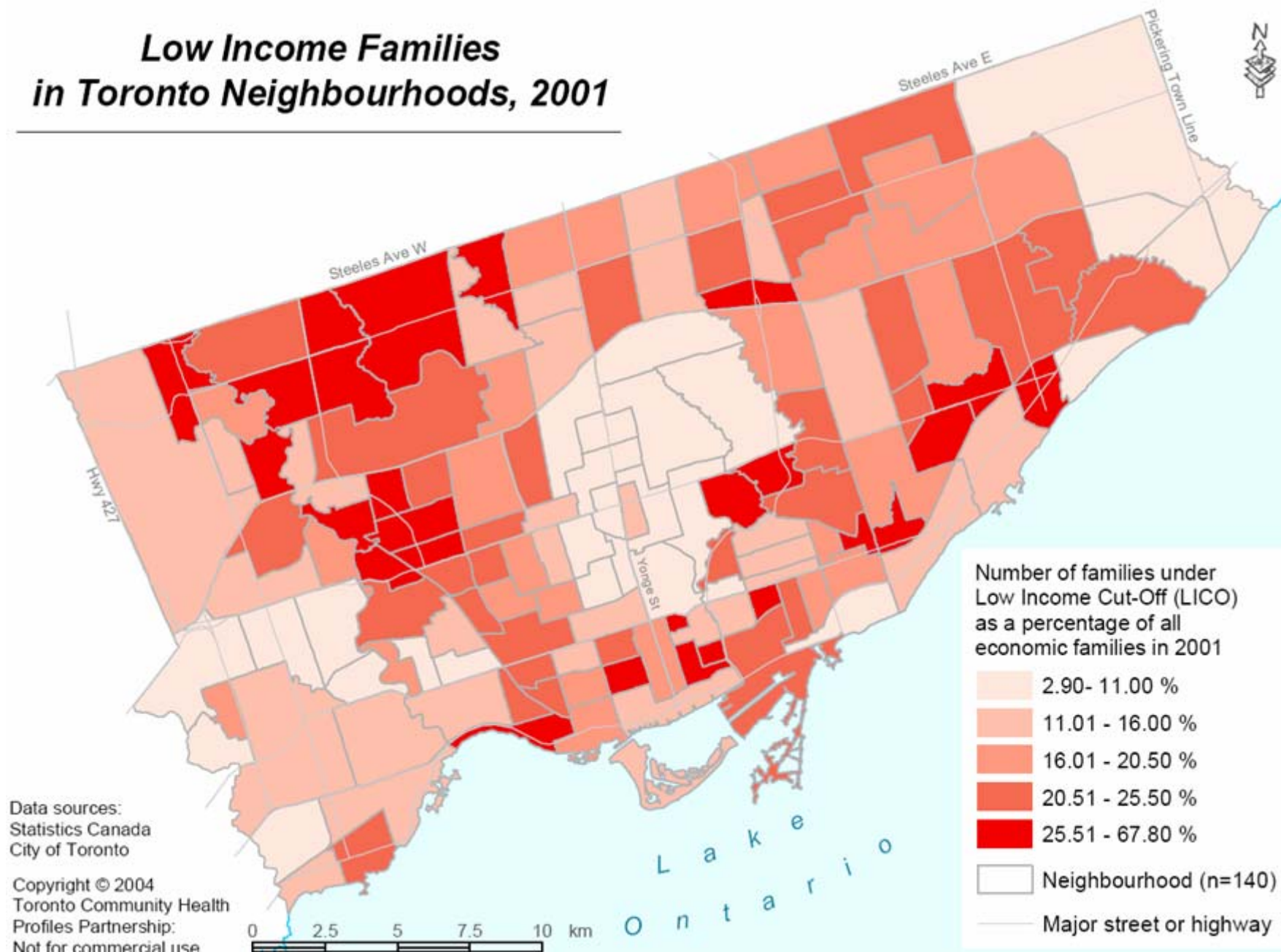
Immigrants 1991-2001 in Toronto Neighbourhoods, 2001



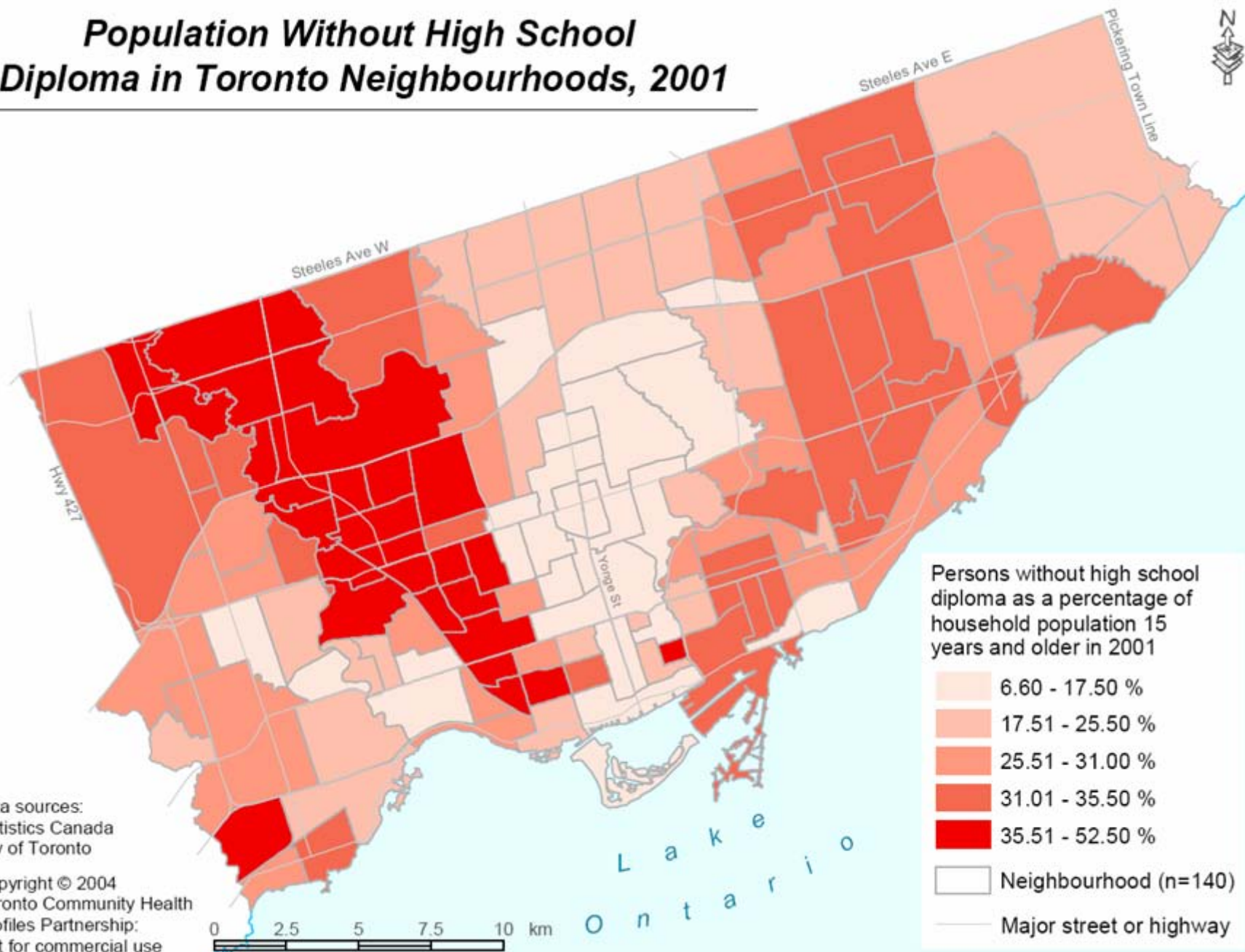
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Low Income Families in Toronto Neighbourhoods, 2001



Population Without High School Diploma in Toronto Neighbourhoods, 2001



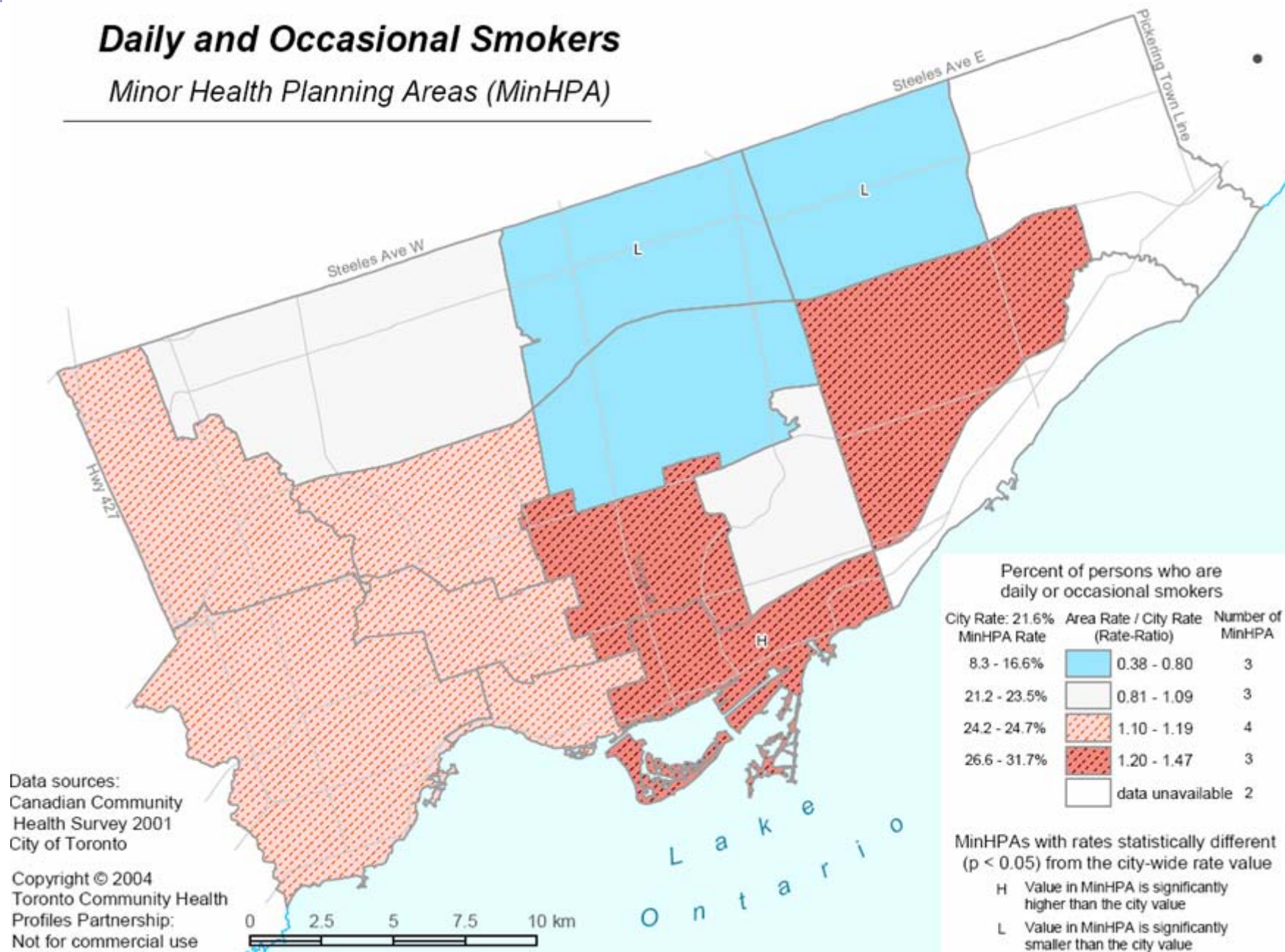

- Agincourt has lower smoking and alcohol use

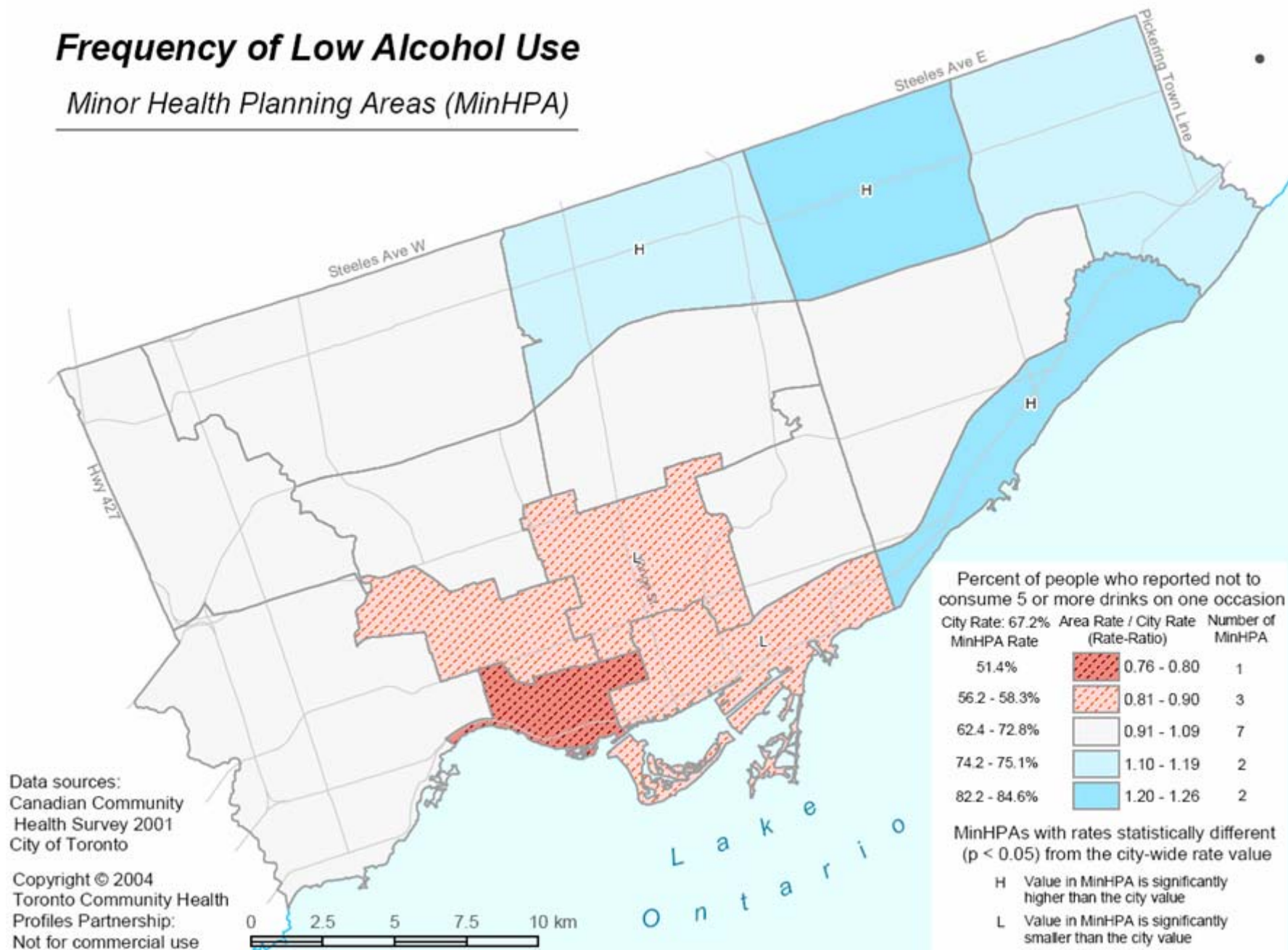
Daily and Occasional Smokers

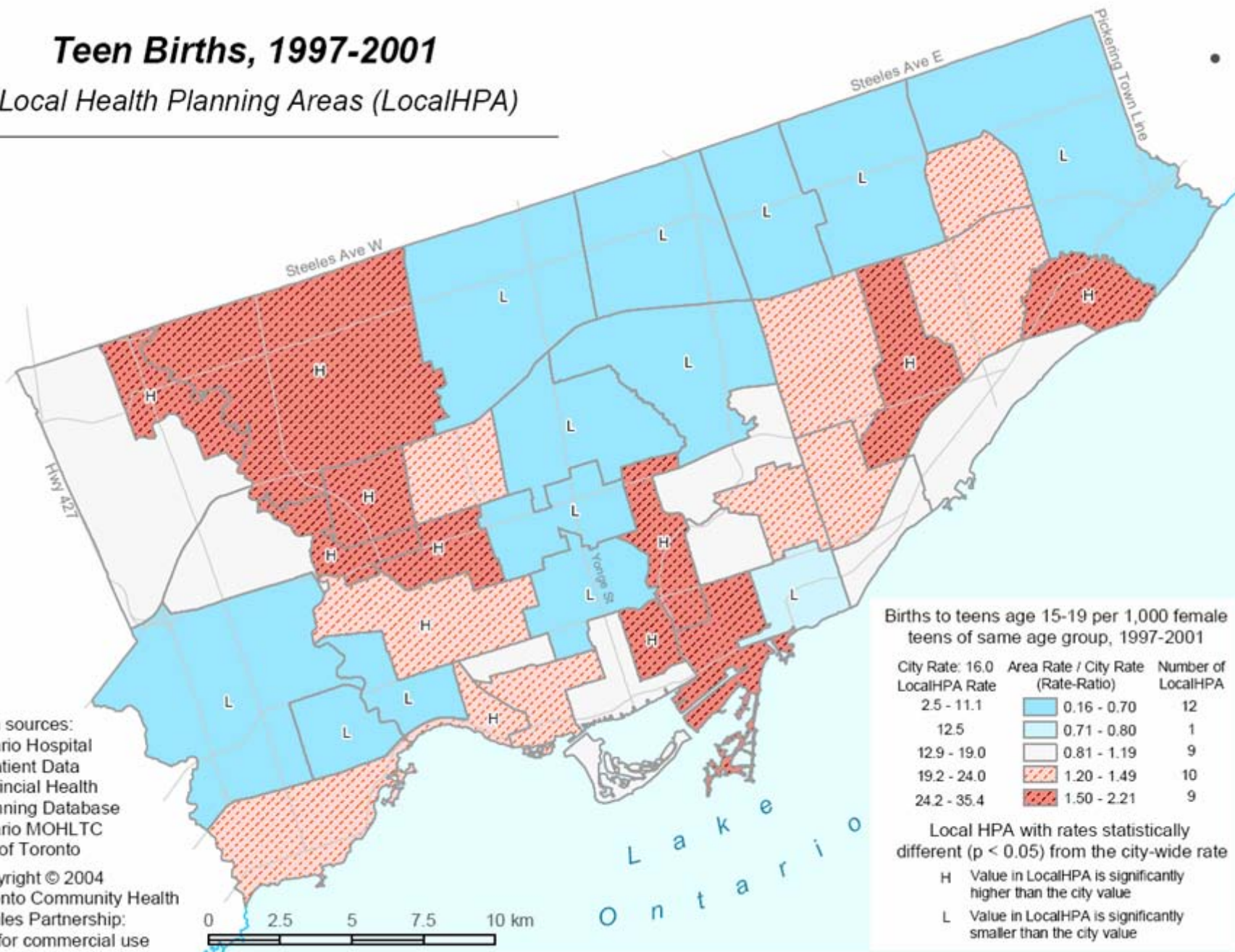

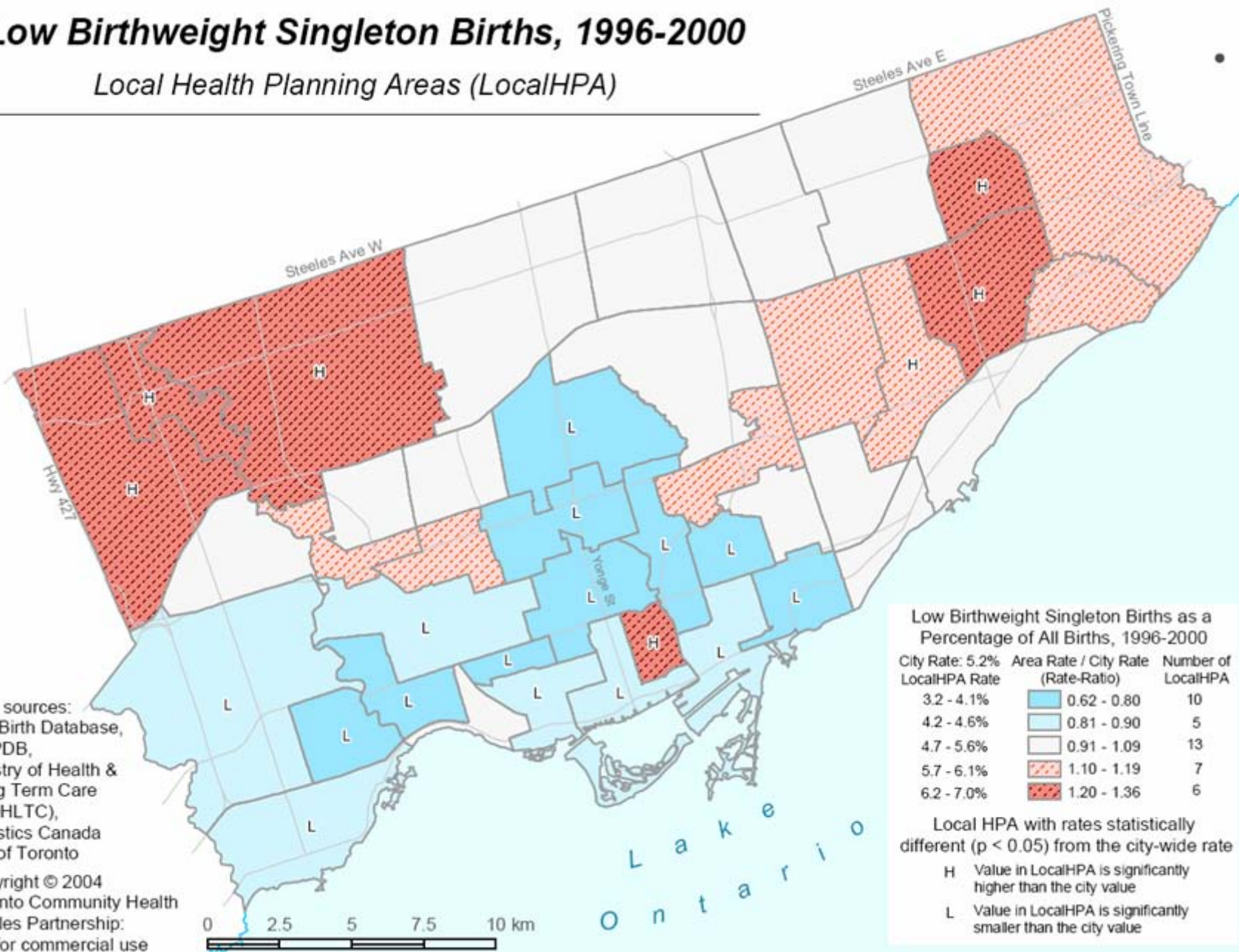


Low Birthweight Singleton Births, 1996-2000

Local HPA with rates statistically different ($p < 0.05$) from the city-wide rate

- H Value in LocalHPA is significantly higher than the city value
- L Value in LocalHPA is significantly smaller than the city value



What the tale tells us

- Immigrant neighbourhoods

- ☐ vary a great deal socio-demographically
- ☐ have different health needs

- Needs-based planning

- ☐ would suggest quite different programs and services for each area depending on needs

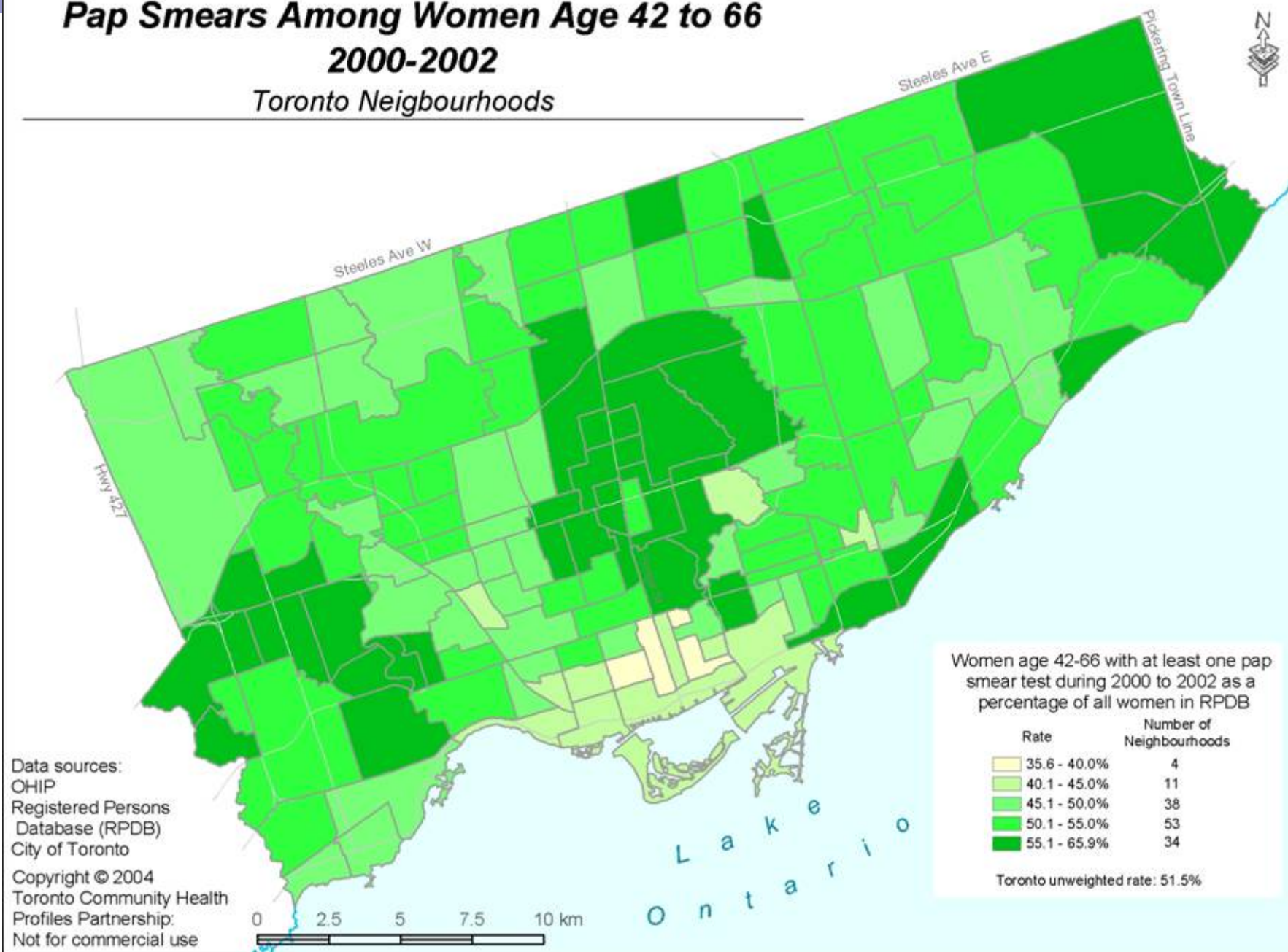

Next Steps

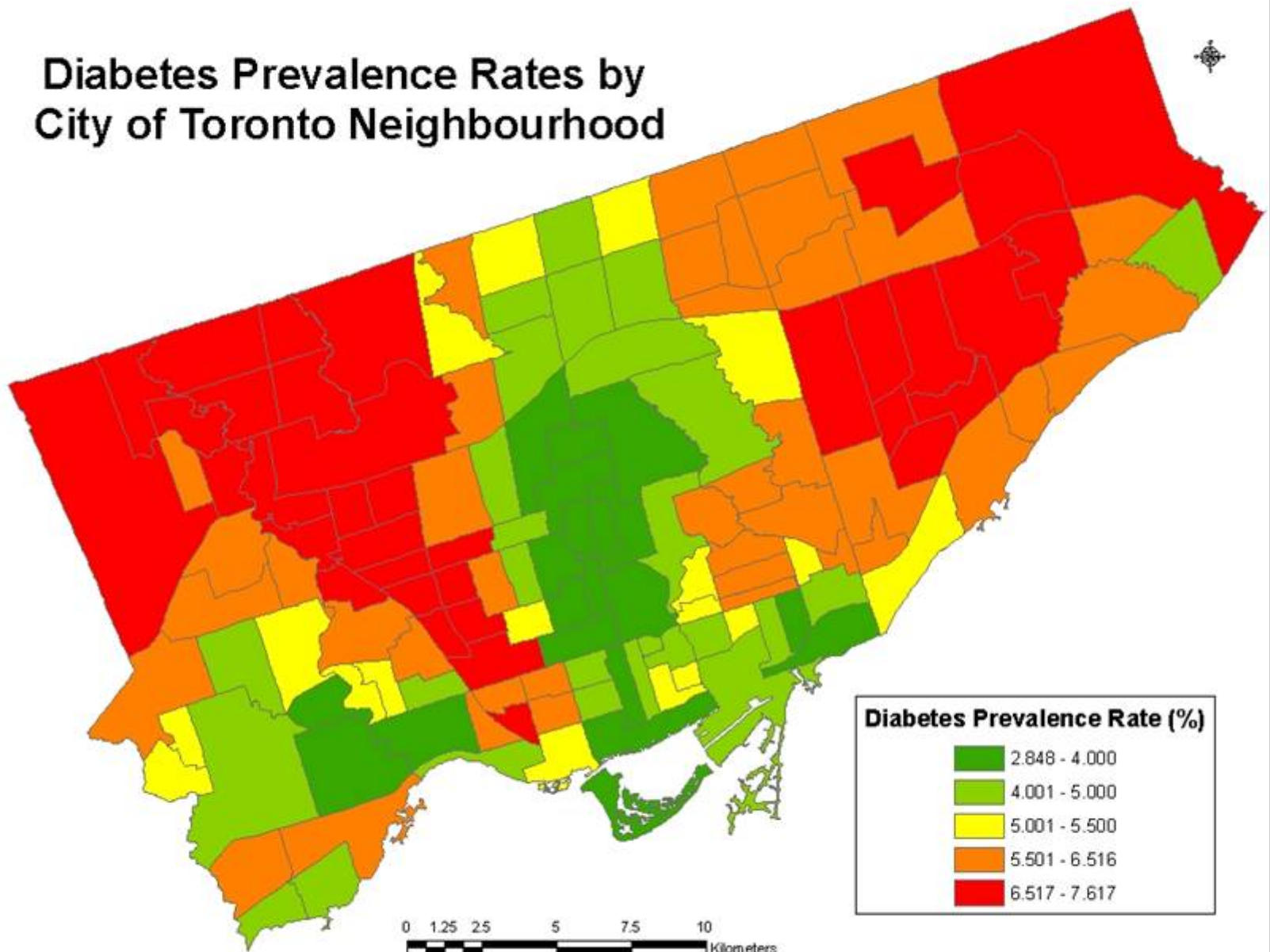
- Toronto Centre and area LHINs
- Site not yet complete
 - Child health/young families (child poverty)
 - Adult health and disease (chronic disease, oral health, mental health, disability)
 - Seniors (adult indicators plus medications, home care, long-term care, disability)
 - Prevention (cancer screening, immunizations, checkups)
 - Mortality (age-adjusted, PYLL, healthy life expectancy)
 - Equity (by SES, immigration)
- Watch for maps of clustering, walking and transit times, interactive mapping

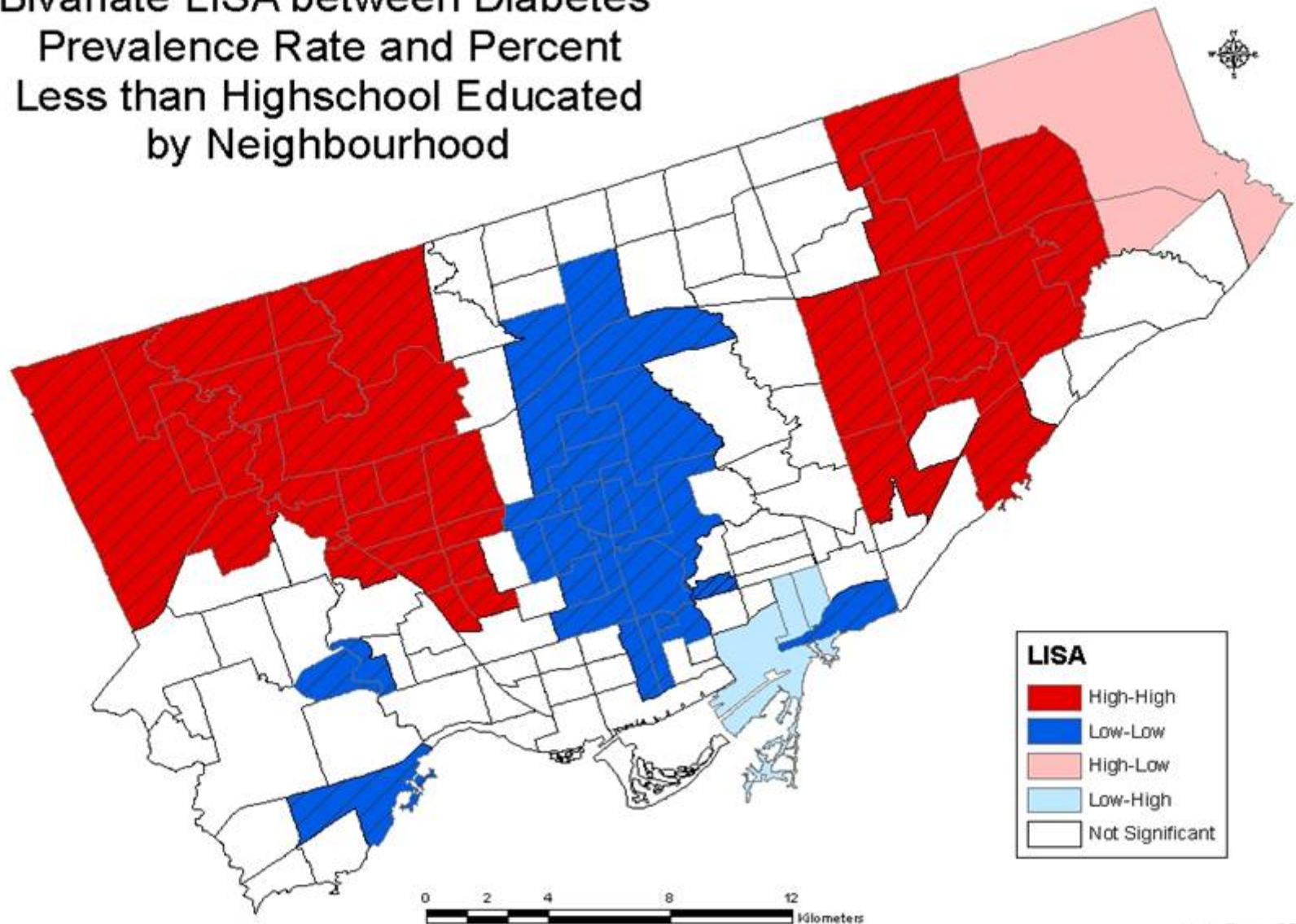


Diabetes Prevalence Rates by City of Toronto Neighbourhood

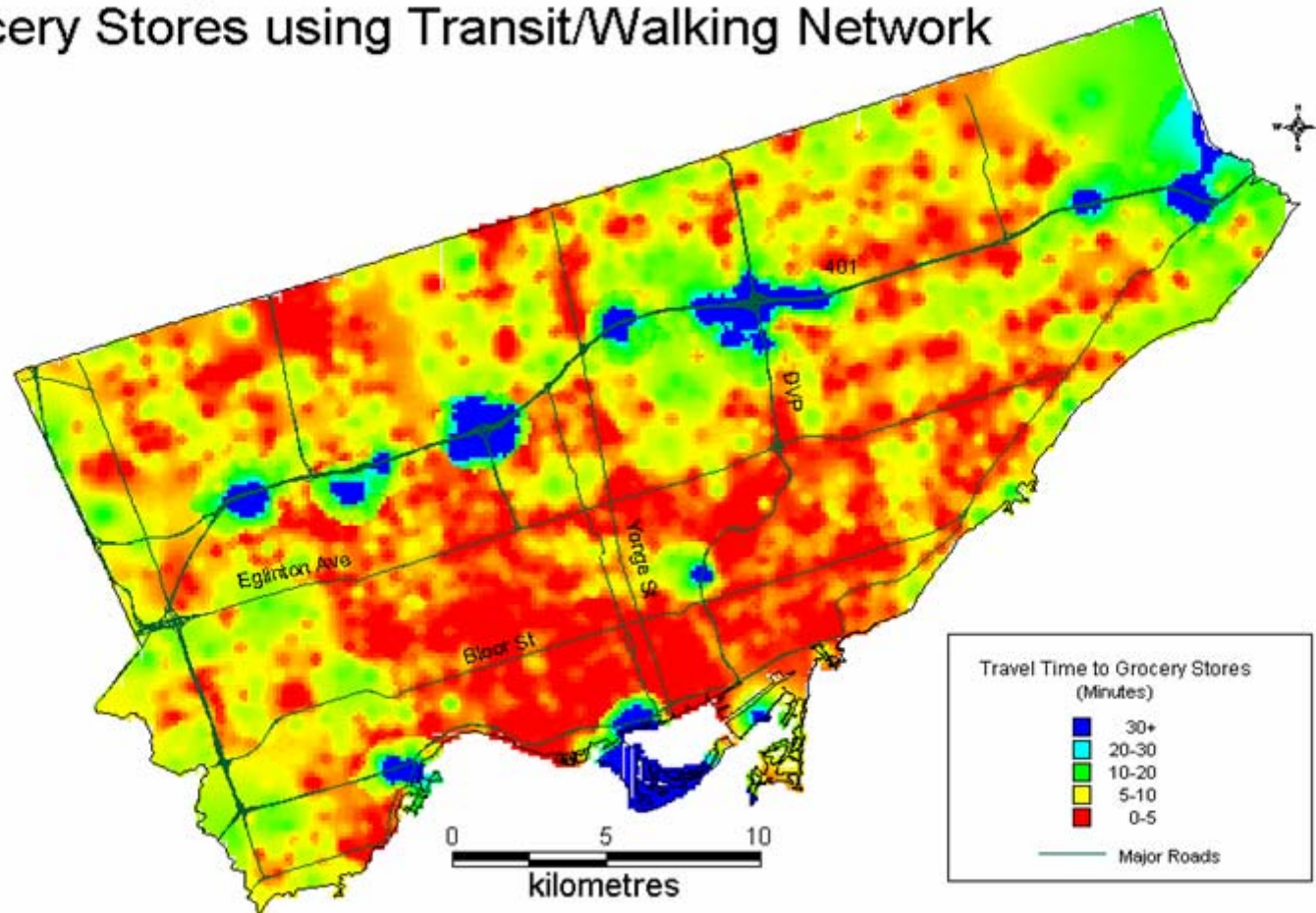
